Basic Needs in Branford

The long economic struggle has taken a toll on many people in Branford. Our town is blessed to have a small but effective safety net that is administered by a number of agencies. Each agency

has seen an increase in requests for help and is scrambling to keep up with the need.

Rev. Sharon is part of a small group that organized an

event called the Branford Basic Needs Summit which brought together all helping agencies along with other community leaders to identify the scope of the growing need and what the cost might be to actually meet those needs. The United Way of New Haven took part in the Summit and looks forward to working with us.

Having brought together everyone's facts and figures, the plan is to imagine a community that says that we will not allow anyone in our community to fall into desperation.

Throughout the summer, residents of Branford will be challenged to find a way to be involved with **Branford Cares** – a town-wide initiative with the goal of raising \$300,000 to fund basic needs for our

neighbors. Every organization, business, club, neighborhood, and individual is invited to exercise their creativity and have fun raising their contribution. Lemonade stands to black tie dinners, we are only limited by our imagination. If everyone does a bit, our neighbors will have the help they need. See **branfordcares.org** for more information.

The impulse to skip over Good Friday, at least emotionally, is hard to resist. We know what happens, why do we have to focus on such misery? Without real attention to Good Friday, we sanitize the sacrifice. By covering our eyes, we don't have to see what still lurks in the human heart. Without our encounter with the cross on Friday, Easter Sunday is a watered down pretty day. Be courageous and walk with Jesus through the hard week without anticipating the end of the story.

For one group, the Choir, it is a particular challenge. We rehearse the Easter music in the midst of Holy Week. That requires us to put a kind of emotional force field around us as we sing those joyous phrases. It's a necessary challenge because otherwise, we confuse the energy of Holy Week.

I received a lovely gift from **Bob Adamson**, one of Trinity's more senior members. He gave me his own copy of Handel's *Messiah*, an original octavo edition from Novello's in London. Bob's father bought it in Scotland for two shillings and sixpence (about a quarter). I will be honored to sing the *Hallelujah Chorus* out of it on Easter morning. Even though Bob can't get to church any more, he'll be present in that score. Thank you, Bob.
