Cheever Tyler's Facebook page says this about himself: "I am a recovering lawyer and now a wandering "do goodnik," who believes in God and kindness." This man has lived a lifetime of kindness. Cheever, a graduate of Yale College class of '59, found New Haven to be

a community where he could raise six children while he worked at the law firm of Wiggin and Dana.

Cheever is an accomplished photographer, playwright, poet, filmmaker, sculptor, author, lawyer, activist, and philanthropist. He was *Business New Haven's* choice for 2003 Citizen of the Year where he was described as "the Elm City's indefatigable do-gooder, ringleader to gooddeed-doers, cheerleader if ever there was one."

The Arts Council of Greater New Haven bestowed its C. Newton Schenck III Lifetime Achievement Award on Tyler for his consistent support and activity in the arts. His plays, short stories and poetry have been enjoyed by many. He has produced two books about the arts in New Haven and is working on two more.

He has successfully led fundraising campaigns for dozens of nonprofit organizations. These you will recognize: the Shubert Theater, United Way, Connecticut Public Television, Columbus House, the University of New Haven, and the New Haven Public Education Fund.

Now that Cheever worships at Trinity, the "do goodniking" continues. Rev. Sharon spoke about Branford Cares in her sermon, and Cheever immediately (literally, at the Peace!) offered a \$2,500 match to kids under 18. Please make sure any child you know is aware of this match. Encourage children to think about others less fortunate than themselves--perhaps friends at school or in the neighborhood—and come up with an idea on how to raise money over the summer that would help kids and their families in need. Report on Table of Chairs Meeting, June 26th, 2012

Outreach chair Kim Humphrey reported we are assisting the Cen-

ter Pole Empowering Youth program for the Crow Indian Reservation. This is an initiative to help Native American groups. Kim also reported Outreach is very busy on many fronts and there is always room for more participation.

Parish Life chair Peter Hayes reported First Sunday breakfast was discussed which everyone agrees is a great time of fellowship. We kicked around ideas on what we could do to encourage more folks to participate.

Building and Grounds chair Mike McGuiness is gathering information and quotes to repair the flooring in the nursery and Godly play areas. If schedules and budgets allow we would like to complete this work this summer. ~ Updates at the Rectory continue with some tile work in the upstairs bathroom. ~ The water issues in the undercroft and Rectory basement have been remedied. ~ We are looking for someone to oversee the maintenance of our landscaping in coordination with Mike. If you or someone you know might be interested please contact Mike.

Worship chair Sandy Baldwin reported lay readers have completed training. She also mentioned she is looking for ushers for the 10 o'clock service. Sunday attendance is holding steady. We discussed doing a parishwide call to "check in" with parishioners. This will most likely be done by Vestry late summer/fall.

Finance Ministry chair Bill Baskin reported that even in this struggling economy our funds are doing well and continue to grow. Bill reported the Legacy Fund is already up to \$57,000, which is a great start. He talked about how fortunate we are to have **Katherine Rowe** serving as the assistant treasurer. She is organizing and streamlining our day-to-day finical management system working closely with Bill. We continue to seek a Treasurer to work with Katherine and Bill.

Sharon filled in for **Spirituality Ministry** chair Bob Barnett reporting they are asking our college students to fill out a questionnaire to see how we can stay in touch and provide value while they are at school. It was suggested that we do the same with our armed forces members.

Sharon also reported for **Christian Education** chair Martha Monico, that Education is working on a monthly adult forum, looking for how much interest there is in the parish.

Mark reported that the Vestry is planning to meet with Bishop Laura Ahrens on Tuesday, September $18^{\rm th}$ and invited the ToC to join that meeting.
