Last year Reverend Sharon dared us to dream. She asked the Outreach Ministry (then called the Missions Committee) to think big—to imagine what we would do if we had an abundance of resources...what would we do?

We already had our ongoing projects— Angel Tree, Columbus House, Community Dining Room, and a few New Haven organizations—that we have supported for years. More recently we began a relationship with Common Hope and began supporting children in Guatemala.

Each year we held various fundraisers, like our annual International Dinner which allowed our parish to contribute a few hundred dollars to Fuel Assistance in Branford. For a small group, we touched many lives by



stretching our dollars as far as anyone could. We are so grateful to the generous people of Trinity.

In 2011 Outreach is a line item in the budget

and our Ministry is responsible for distributing these funds at a local, regional/national, and international level. We have tended our \$6,000 carefully. We were able to add \$2,000 through various fundraising events.

At this point in time, the needs in our community and the world have grown exponentially. We all have the same ultimate goal: to assist as many less fortunate people as possible. Many members of the Trinity family are coming forward to volunteer (Continued on page 2)

Pre-school and Elementary School Christian Formation

In our Godly Play Worship Centers, children have an opportunity to be with God, to talk to God, to listen to God, to wonder about

God, and to hear stories of God. The children are surrounded by stories of Christian tradition; sacred stories from the Old and New Testaments, stories that Christ has given to all of us in the parables and stories about the liturgical cycle.

Preschoolers, kindergarteners and 1st graders are in one room, and the second room is dedicated to 2nd 3rd, 4th and 5th graders. Church school begins at 9:45, and children are dismissed in time to join their family upstairs for the Eucharist

Middle School Christian Formation

Trinity's 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th graders meet Sunday mornings from 9:45 am to 10:45 am for fun, fellowship, food and religious investigation. Our youth room is where we explore our faith together with our peers and adult teachers who rotate leading and facilitating the class.



The curriculum used to instigate discussions and learn the word of God is The Thoughtful Christian, which incorporates games, music, media, art work, role playing, and service or sharing. Overnight and community activities are coordinated with events sponsored by the Episcopal Diocese of Connecticut and the Town of Branford's ecumenical community.

Preparing for a cold winter

At a meeting of the Branford Clergy Association, First Selectman Unk Daros was in attendance and spoke about the dramatic increase of need in our community. The number of children that are enrolled in the school breakfast and lunch program has doubled. The food agencies in town are struggling to keep up. Heating oil costs are high, and government grants have been cut. There are people sleeping under overpasses.

The clergy were unanimous in their desire to be a part of developing a plan before winter gets here. A task force is being assembled from all of the resource agencies in town. One plan already in place is for a warming station with overnight capacity for those who have no way to stay warm. Unk has committed to providing the place, and we hope that the churches will be able to provide volunteers to help with meals.

The measure of a community is how it cares for those who struggle. Let us pray that Branford is righteous in God's eyes.

Help for members of Trinity

In the 1880s, a man named **Eli Goodrich**, a faithful member of Trinity parish, died and left his house to the church. The house was sold and the proceeds have been held in trust at the Branford Probate Court ever since. Needless to say, the sum of money involved has grown over the years and according to Eli's will, the accumulated interest is to be used for those in need in the Trinity Church congregation. That means if someone stumbles into some difficulties

TRICK-OR-TREAT FOR UNICEF



For the third year, Trinity youth will Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF during Halloween. After collecting coins in special boxes while celebrating Halloween, the boxes are turned back into Trinity and monies sent to UNICEF in New York. Since 1950, Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF

has been raising money to build wells for clean drinking water, provide life-saving immunizations and train teachers, gather school supplies, and build schools for children to attend. Started by children to help children around the world, Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF helps educate children about the importance of giving to those less fortunate.

It's Turkey Time!

The Branford Food Pantry hopes to have 500 Thanksgiving meals to share with families in our town that might not otherwise have one. Last year the Turkey project headed up by



the Congregational Church contributed 80 of the frozen fowl. This year, the Branford Clergy Association is joining forces, and we hope to push that number up to at least 150. Each congregation is asked to invite people to underwrite a turkey or fixings. Vouchers will be on sale after each November service. Please pay with cash or check. Eligible participants are identified by social service agencies in Branford and invited to attend. Trinity's Closet is open between 8:30 am to 12:30 pm on the 5th. Items needed include: gently used warm winter clothing including coats and jackets; cleaning supplies (general, laundry, kitchen and bathroom); personal hygiene items, male and female, (shampoo, toothpaste, floss, hairspray, Qtips); household items (bed linens, towels, pillows); and kitchen items (small items).
